#	Question	Answer
1	When will we be able to enter our classes to begin purging and packing? When will we receive our boxes?	Administrators worked with the Facilities Move Team to develop an individual schedule and plan to pack during the month of May.
2	When will we be receiving our boxes and be allowed to start packing?	
3	Is the date to have everything packed up still the same?	
4	Will you share the video about how our boxes are to be marked?	
5	How will construction be impacted by COVID19?	Public works projects are an essential government function and will remain on schedule. Contractors were all directed to comply with social distancing protocol and have measures in place to ensure the safety of their workers and the community.
6	Will Special Education classes in grade 1 be affected by renovations? If so, in what ways?	All classroom instruction will remain unchanged during the renovation. The construction work is being scheduled in Phases. During the course of the project, each classroom will be relocated to allow for the construction to be performed.
7	What will classroom assignments be like for our Special Education students in grade 1 during this time?	Classroom assignments during construction have been developed by the school Administrator.
8	Will students be attending Madison for the 2020-2021 school year or will they have to relocate?	All students in grades K-2 will remain at Madison for the 2020-2021 school year. Students in grades 3-5th will be attending Riley's interim housing for the 2020-2021 school year.
9	Has the project scope changed?	No, the project scope has not changed.
10	What is the actual phasing plan? Has the phasing plan changed?	As presented on 2/6/20, construction will be completed in 3 phases and has not changed: Phase 1: Auditorium, Building B and C, Phase 2:



		Building A and Phase 3: Building D.
11	What is the actual project start date? (Date when contractor will mobilize on site)	The contractor will begin mobilizing in early July 2020.
12	Project end date?	Construction will be completed in August 2021.
13	Can neighbors get a site plan showing: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Contractor Staging Area</li> <li>2. Contractor Crews and Sub Contractors Designated Parking Area (on and off site)</li> <li>3. Contractor Delivery Route for materials and equipment</li> </ol>	Please refer to the phasing/logistics plan in the current presentation, slide 12. Contractor delivery route for materials and equipment is TBD.
14	Is the underground sewer line for Building A being fully replaced?	The underground sewer line located on the south side of Building A will be replaced.
15	What is the paint color scheme for Madison?	Colors are currently being finalized based on the District's recently updated standards.
16	Can Madison security gates be painted to match the color of the building?	Security gates will be painted to match the district standard color - black.
17	With children security in mind, should site drop off and pick up be evaluated and planned now, and then implemented once modernization is over and students and staff are back on site?	Site drop-off/pick-up remains unchanged.
18	If the contractor vehicle traffic damages or prematurely wears the neighborhood street asphalt, are they required to repair it to condition it was prior to construction?	The LBUSD works closely with City of LB officials to ensure our activities comply with all requirements. In some instances, the LBUSD is required to repair/replace City streets that are impacted during construction.
19	We understood from the last meeting that if the contractor damages site asphalt playgrounds, that they will repair it. Madison had some large asphalt cracks on playground...can these asphalt maintenance repairs be performed at the end of Modernization so that the playground asphalt is safe for returning students?	Contractor is required to repair any damage to asphalt caused by construction. Asphalt replacement is not in the project scope of work. However, it has been identified in the Master Plan and will be assessed at a future date.
